Comprehensive Visit Prep = Hiking Prep





- Assess the trail/conditions

 - Tools (first aid, multi-tool, etc.)











- ✓ Is Rio meeting the Criteria for Accreditation?
- Do we have quality assurance and evidence that the college is accomplishing our mission and purposes?
- ✓ Is Rio pursuing institutional improvement?
- ✓ Does Rio comply with requirements set by the U.S. Department of Education?

Criteria for Accreditation

Criteria for accreditation are the standards of quality by which HLC determines whether an institution merits accreditation or reaffirmation of accreditation.

Roles of Criterion Tri-Chairs:

- Review content from Year Four Assurance Argument.
- Update and revise as needed.
- Identify updated or additional required evidence.
- Facilitate criterion awareness college-wide.





Criterion One: Mission

- Grievance policy for faculty, staff, and students.
- ✓ A sample of academic student organizations and clubs demonstrating the diversity of groups on campus.

Criterion Three: Teaching and Learning: Quality Resources and Support




The institution provided quality education, wherever and however its offerings are delivered.

- Evidence of attainment of strategic planning goals.






Communication/Employee Engagement
